AUGUST 2022 UPDATE



KRISHNAN SUTHANTHIRAN, Founder and President of TeamBest Global Companies (TBG), celebrated the 50th year—half a century—of his career in Medicine/Radiation Therapy, in July of 2022.

Suthanthiran lost his father to cancer in 1968 and this tragic event helped to formulate his main career goal: to dedicate his life to Medicine—particularly Cancer Research and Treatment. In 1971, after earning his masters degree in Engineering from Carleton University in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, Suthanthiran began a position as an engineer in 1972 at Freedmen's Hospital (now Howard University Hospital) in Washington, DC, under the late Dr. Ulrich K. Henschke, MD, of then newly created Department Radiation Therapy.

In 1987, he founded the Brachytherapy Research and Educational Foundation (BREF), as a nonprofit private 501(c)(3) nongovernmental organization and continues to support it financially. BREF published *Brachytherapy: Conquering Cancer—The First One Hundred Years* in 2013 and distributed thousands of these books, free of charge, to medical professionals at various conferences.

In January of 2005, Suthanthiran purchased the dormant mining town of Kitsault, in British Columbia, Canada. He then announced plans for a dedicated energy corridor/port/terminal near Kitsault to export energy products to Europe/Asia/North & South America. In January of 2013, Kitsault Energy (KE), was established and presently oversees the town of Kitsault. KE has secured the approval of the National Energy Board of Canada to export 20 million tons of liquefied natural gas (LNG) a year. In addition, Enbridge/Spectra Energy and TC Energy have approved multiple pipelines to pass through or near Kitsault. The town of Kitsault was originally designed and built to provide for and meet the needs of more than 1000 residents. The town offers housing (dormant currently), banking, postal service, supermarket, restaurant, recreational, medical and other services.

In 2007, Suthanthiran established the Best Cure Foundation (BCF) to launch his Global Healthcare Delivery Program. BCF aims to establish a hub-and-spoke model with express/mobile clinics, linked to general and multi-specialty medical centers to focus on Best Cure Total Health System of prevention, early detection and effective treatment using Best Cure Proactive Healthcare of Full Transparency on Clinical Outcome, Benefits and Cost; Best Cure U.S. Health Corps; Best Cure International Health Corps; Best Cure Global Institute; Best Cure Global Standard of Care; Best Cure Global Purchasing Organization; Best Cure Global Insurance.

On April 29, 2015, Suthanthiran launched his Global War on Cancer, in memory of his late father. As a result, Harvard University Medical School honored Suthanthiran, by inviting him on April 29, 2016 to become an annual keynote speaker at their Global Cancer Care Summit for Mid to Low Income Countries.

Subsequently, in memory of his mother, Suthanthiran established a division under BCF—3E: Education, Empowerment and Equality—to promote women and the underprivileged globally.

Recently, Suthanthiran created the Proud American Foundation to Promote Manufacturing, Job Creation and High-Tech Industrial Growth in the USA—to bolster American manufacturing. As part of this plan, he intends to launch a project creating 1 million sq. feet of high-tech manufacturing facilities/corporate campuses (complete with residences), healthcare/daycare and other services (similar to his town Kitsault), using thousands of acres, land he currently owns. These land parcels are designated for heavy industrial, commercial and residential use.

Suthanthiran has supported fully all his commercial and nonprofit charitable foundation activities by himself over the last half a century. In recognition of his 50 years of service and innovative contributions to medicine, Suthanthiran was honored by Reverend Jesse Jackson and his son, congressman-elect Jonathan Jackson, on July 11, 2022 at the Madison Hotel in Washington, DC with a trophy. In addition, Suthanthiran was invited to the Washington, DC offices of Congressman Danny Davis and Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi where he was honored with medals of recognition for his service, support and contributions to the field of medicine.

The president of Rhema University, Dr. Roger Richardson, and its Board of Trustees also honored Suthanthiran in July of 2022 at the AAPM Exhibit Hall with an Honorary Doctorate Degree in Business Administration for his lifetime achievements in businesses.

Witnessing the public and private healthcare systems being corrupt, inefficient, expensive and wasteful, Suthanthiran launched his six-part Best Cure Global Healthcare Delivery, with a combination of nonprofit and for profit public entities, into the global healthcare delivery economy of 15 Trillion USD plus, which increases by 10% or more annually due to increases in cost and population.

Suthanthiran's TBG Companies have been the pioneer/inventor of many technologies used in radiation therapy for cardiovascular restenosis and malignant/nonmalignant diseases.

He plans to launch a series of docudramas under the working title, "No Good Deed Goes Unpunished," covering his life experiences, personal history, half a century in medicine, and businesses in various parts of the world.

For more than seven decades, TBG has helped to save millions of lives a year. A few thousand medical centers worldwide rely on the use of TBG Companies products.

Suthanthiran plans to soon announce the launch of his Best Cure Global Healthcare Delivery. He plans to establish one thousand proactive/preventative/primary/general/multi specialty medical centers linked to express and mobile clinics globally offering a full range of medical services.

Krishnan Suthanthiran was born in India, starting his education in elementary school at grade 1, when he was less than 5 years old, without having the opportunity to begin in preschool. At an early age, he became aware of the importance of following through on his word and fulfilling his tasks and assignments on time. Once realizing that he could not afford the standard school supplies and books for class while he was attending elementary, he quickly took initiative and began buying candies in bulk, selling them to his classmates during recreational breaks, and would even sell these to other students at various schools in the town when his own Catholic school had days off. This industriousness ensured that he would have the proper tools to continue his studies and excel the way he did.

In September 1969, Krishnan Suthanthiran traveled to Canada from India, after having graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from University of Madras, India, to pursue his Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering at Carleton University in Ottawa, Ontario. He arrived with a total of 400 Canadian Dollars. Subsequently, he received a National Research Council of Canada Research Assistantship which helped him to meet his financial needs. All of his college education was financed using merit scholarship and Research Assistantship. He graduated with a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1971 from Carleton University.

In the summer of 1972, he traveled to the United States as a Landed Immigrant, with a Permanent Resident Visa and arrived in Washington, DC in late June. He liked the beauty of Washington, DC and decided to look for employment in the area with hopes of remaining there. From that time on, he decided to remain in Washington, DC to pursue employment, and was fortunate to be recruited by an Oncologist at Howard University (formerly known as Freedmen's) Hospital in mid-July 1972. This was the realization of his goal to work in Cancer Research and Treatment, having lost his father to Cancer in 1968. Shortly after that in 1973, he became involved in part-time business of supplying medical supplies to hospitals.

He has founded multiple companies and invested hundreds of millions of US dollars globally during the past 40 years, in medical products manufacturing, healthcare delivery, real estate, entertainment, and energy. His family of medical companies is known collectively as TeamBest Global. He founded and supports a few non-profit charitable organizations to make quality education and healthcare affordable and accessible globally. Mahatma Gandhi dreamt of a free India. Today, it is the world's largest democracy. With a similar spirit of idealism, Mr. Suthanthiran has said that "I, too, have a dream — one shared by millions of our fellow citizens of the World — and a plan to realize this dream of quality healthcare and education that are affordable and accessible to all." Mr. Suthanthiran strongly believes that "Everyone deserves the best healthcare, and education is the most effective way to eliminate poverty, improve global health and promote peace." He has contributed substantially to setting up endowed chair and endowments for scholarships at various universities. He has provided significant funding to support medical research and treatment by partnering with academic institutions, national labs, and hospitals around the world.

Having lost his father to Cancer while he was an undergraduate student in engineering, he has dedicated his career to Cancer Research and Treatment. TeamBest products are used to treat millions of Cancer patients globally annually. On April 29th 2015, in memory of his father and the millions of people affected by Cancer, he launched his career-long goal of a 'Global War on Cancer' (http://www.teambest.com/press/GlobalWarOnCancer_PressRelease_April2015.pdf) by promoting Proactive Healthcare Delivery Systems worldwide, which are focused on transparency of clinical benefits, outcome, and cost. Using a Total Health Approach through prevention, early detection, and effective treatment, improvement of clinical outcomes are possible at a significantly lower cost. There is an Indian Proverb that says, "A healthy person has many wishes, but a sick person only has one. Health is wealth."

TeamBest Global (TBG) and Best Cure Foundation (BCF) are planning to create a global standard of healthcare delivery system using a hub-and-spoke model, with express and mobile clinics linked to general and super-specialty medical centers, with hopes of reducing suffering and deaths from all disease by 50% or more by the end of the next decade. BCF is also working towards providing purified drinking water and affordable sewer systems in every part of the world, by the end of the next decade. Mr. Suthanthiran has established a division under BCF called "3E — Education, Empowerment and Equality" to promote the development and advancement of women and the underprivileged. He has said, "I believe the power of our message can trump governments and resistance to positive change."

It is his belief that every man and woman was given birth to, nursed, and nourished by women, and therefore, women share a greater responsibility in juggling career and family, in raising children and caring for the home. In some cases, men do take sole or partial responsibility for this task. In memory of his mother, Mr. Suthanthiran is proud to support women around the world in pursuing their goals through the 3E organization. Late former US Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy, brother of late former US President John F. Kennedy once said that, "Each time a man stands up for an ideal, or acts to improve the lot of others, or strikes out against injustice, he sends forth a tiny ripple of hope." This historic quote is one that has influenced Mr. Suthanthiran's strong compassion and hopes of improving quality of life by expanding quality healthcare and education around the world by making them affordable and accessible.

In January 2005, he acquired the town of Kitsault, which was previously known as a mining town and closed by AMAX Canada in October 1983 due to lack of a profitable operation. The mining town accommodated as many as 1200 plus staff and families from 1979–1983. The town remained vacant after the mine was decommissioned until Mr. Suthanthiran's purchase in 2005. He is now making a dedicated Energy Corridor for Canada's energy products, to export from a dedicated Energy Port/Terminal at Kitsault for shipping energy products to Asia and Latin America — a multi-year project, with a possible investment of 30–40 Billion CAD plus (to be raised). KE is engaged in a project to offer Green Energy Products, including Kitsault Biofuel, to turn waste into energy. The process provides a clean, green energy an efficient method to deal with forestry waste. Currently, Kitsault Energy is working with multiple partners who have expressed desire to invest in this project and to be part of a group of customers for the energy products. Albert Einstein once said that "If at first, the idea is not absurd, then there is no hope for it."

Currently, TeamBest Global Companies employs 450 employees globally, with 200 each in Canada and USA. He has invested nearly 200 Million USD of his own funds over the last 16 years in acquiring Real Estate, Medical/Entertainment Companies, in new Product Developments, etc. There is an African Proverb that says "If you want to walk fast, walk alone. If you want to walk far, walk together."

Some of Mr. Suthanthiran's companies have been in existence for many decades, some even 100 plus years. The TeamBest Group of medical companies have been saving millions of lives annually and continues to do so. He strongly believes that "Life is a gift from our parents. Our career is the outcome of what we do with the gift. We can look at every obstacle as an opportunity or every opportunity as an obstacle. Who we are, what we are, and where we are have a lot to do with the choices we have made and the ones we did not. We are born to live, live to enjoy and cherish our gift."
